WHAT DOES IT COST?

- Families will be accommodated together, except where other arrangements have been requested. Young people can be accommodated with friends provided that they are not younger than 12 and have parental permission.
- Ages refer to the child ages at the time of the conference.
- Single rooms are very limited and will be offered on a needs basis.
- CWM Europe follows the refund policy of The Pioneer Centre at the following rates. If you cancel:
 - 4 months prior to the conference 50% reimbursement.
 - 2 months prior 25% reimbursement.
 - 6 weeks or less prior no reimbursement.

The conference price includes four outdoor activities for all, three morning activities for the youth groups, a campfire and use of the swimming pool. Additional activities are available but are not included in the conference price.

WHAT IS IT?

Window on the World is a holiday conference organised by the Council for World Mission European Region taking place 7th-13th August 2010. At Window on the World Christians of all ages can meet the world church, learn more about mission and grow in faith. Challenging theme talks, lively and creative worship, outdoor activities, sports and entertainments, meeting old and making new friends is all part of the Window on the World experience.

The conference theme is *Hold the Christ-Light* and will explore the relationship between worship and mission. Worship should inspire God's people to engage in mission which in turn informs worship. We will develop this lively relationship and consider both how we share the good news with our neighbours and how faith sharing transforms worship. How do our churches need to be transformed by the good news so we can better share the good news?



Window on the World 2010 will give us space to think about these questions and many more. We will have time to share stories of the churches we belong to and about the churches we dream of becoming.



The main theme talks will be given by Revd Dr Janet Wootton, Director of Studies in The Congregational Federation. Janet is well known as a hymn writer, liturgist, theologian and author of worship books.

WHO WILL BE THERE?



Morning worship will be led by SIYAYA a group of young people from the JL ZWANE Centre, Guguleto, South Africa. Bringing together traditional

African songs, jazz, contemporary music and dance, worship led by Siyaya will be lively and exciting.

Window on the World **will be chaired** by Revd Dr Geraint Tudur, General Secretary of the Union of Welsh Independents and Chair of CWM Europe. Geraint was born and studied in Bangor, north Wales. Geraint's main interest when not working is photography.

WHERE IS IT?

Window on the World **will be held at** the Pioneer Centre, an outdoor activity Centre in Clebury Mortimer, near Kidderminster, England. Located in an attractive 25-acre site, the Centre offers supervised activities such as abseiling, orienteering, archery, swimming and fencing. The centre has a dining room, which seats up to 300 people, two plenary halls, several comfortable lounges and a number of activity rooms. The centre has a shop and an alcohol free bar. The Pioneer Centre does not permit the consumption of alcohol.



The Pioneer Centre is on the edge of the Wyre Forest, which offers both wildlife and walking. The Severn Valley Railway, West Midlands Safari Park and Iron Bridge Open Air Museum are amongst attractions in the area.

IS IT FOR EVERYONE?

Young people are warmly welcomed and important to the conference. There is a crèche for babies and toddlers and a daily morning programme for the 4-7, 8-11, 11-14 and 15+ groups. If you plan to bring a group of young people to the conference, please contact CWM Europe beforehand to discuss accommodation and group discounts before sending in the booking form. Under-18's who come without their parents or legal guardians must be accompanied by a 'responsible adult' who is 25 or over.



ACCOMODATION

Accommodation at The Pioneer Centre is in Canadian-themed lodges. Each lodge has a number of en-suite bedrooms which sleep 3, 2 or 5 people in bunk and single-tier beds. The Pioneer Centre also offers bedrooms for guests with mobility difficulties. A very limited number of single rooms are available at a higher price which will be assigned on the basis of need.
